Students in all the BSN tracks in the College of Nursing at Michigan State University are exposed to a variety of clinical sites in diverse settings throughout the state of Michigan. Additionally, the College of Nursing possesses a simulation and media laboratory containing state-of-the-art equipment designed to enhance student learning. Clinical placements for Accelerated Second Degree students are concentrated largely in the mid-Michigan and southeast Michigan areas. Theory components of the curriculum are offered only on Michigan State University's East Lansing-based campus. All BSN students at Michigan State University may have to travel to their clinical sites in order to meet course requirements. The College of Nursing is not responsible for providing transportation to or from clinical sites.
