The Multi-Ethnic Counseling Center Alliance (MECCA) was a pioneer in the multicultural mental health movement. MECCA was founded in 1969 to deliver career and personal counseling to the entire MSU student body: inclusive of students of color, international students, and other marginalized populations. In addition to outreach, MECCA developed training modules to equip psychologists, counselors, and social workers, to practice in a multicultural and racialized society. Today, every mental health profession requires that "cultural competency" be an integral part of the training, continuing education, and certification of their members.
