When the Yankees take on the Washington Nationals tonight, they'll be doing so exclusively on Prime Video (at least if you live in New York State, Connecticut, northern and central New Jersey, and northeast Pennsylvania).

Last night, the Bronx Bombers played game two of a three-game series against the Nats that ended with missed opportunities for the Yankees and a 4-2 win for the Nationals.

Tonight, they'll face the Washington Nationals for the third of three times during the 2024 season and could end the season series against them with a 2-1 record if they win tonight.

The New York Yankees and Washington Nationals will play on Wednesday at Nationals Park, at 6:45 p.m. ET, with Aaron Judge and Luis Garcia among those expected to deliver at the plate.

The 8.9 strikeouts per nine innings compiled by the Yankees pitching staff ranks sixth in MLB. The Nationals strike out 8.2 batters per nine innings as a pitching staff, 23rd in MLB.

Ahead of watching this Yankees vs. Nationals matchup, here is what you need to know about Wednesday's action on the diamond, including viewing options.

Pitching Matchup

Yankees: Carlos Rodón

Carlos Rodon (14-8) will take the mound for the Yankees, his 27th start of the season.

The left-hander allowed four hits in six scoreless innings pitched against the Colorado Rockies on Friday.

The 31-year-old has pitched to a 4.16 ERA this season with 9.8 strikeouts per nine innings compared to 2.9 walks per nine across 26 games.

In 26 starts this season, he's earned 13 quality starts.

In 26 starts, Rodon has pitched through or past the fifth inning 19 times. He has a season average of 5.4 frames per outing.

He has made 26 appearances and finished four of them without allowing an earned run.

Nationals: MacKenzie Gore

MacKenzie Gore (7-11 with a 4.51 ERA and 140 strikeouts in 131 2/3 innings pitched) makes the start for the Nationals, his 27th of the season.

In his most recent time out on Friday, the left-hander went six innings against the Atlanta Braves, allowing one earned run while surrendering seven hits.

In 26 games this season, the 25-year-old has a 4.51 ERA and 9.6 strikeouts per nine innings, while giving up a batting average of .287 to opposing batters.

Gore enters this game with six quality starts under his belt this year.

Gore is looking for his third straight outing lasting five or more innings. He averages five frames per start.

In two of his appearances this season he did not allow an earned run.
