ANGELA AND RICHARD STRAWN NURSING ENDOWED FELLOWSHIP

Angela and Richard Strawn are longtime supporters of our nursing programs through philanthropy and advocacy. Angela (BSN '65) is a graduate of the MSU College of Nursing. Her career in nursing has so far spanned over 50 years, spent mostly in nursing higher education and administration of nursing education programs. When deciding how to leave a lasting impact on the College of Nursing, Angie decided to provide fellowship assistance at the graduate level to nurses who desired to become future nursing faculty out of concern for the nursing faculty shortage.

This fellowship will be awarded to prospective or matriculating graduate students planning a career in nursing education. Preference is given to highly motivated students who demonstrate financial need and possess a minimum 3.5 GPA.

CAPTAIN SEAN GRIMES NURSING SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established by his beloved family, this scholarship honors Captain Sean Grimes (BSN '97) who was an exceptional student that graduated with honors from the College of Nursing. He was the recipient of a Distinguished Military Graduate Award from the Reserve Officers Training Corps.

Sean enlisted in the Army to make a positive impact in the world. His life tragically ended on March 4, 2005 when his armored Humvee was hit by an improvised explosive device during combat patrol in Ar Ramadi, Iraq. Sean had been in Iraq for about six months when he was killed.

This scholarship provides financial assistance to MSU nursing students that are an Army Reservist, Army National Guard member, active Army soldier or honorably discharged veteran of these branches.

CAROL ROBINSON BEALS ENDOWED NURSING SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The 2025 Spring Michigan State University College of Nursing Alumni Service Award recipient is Julie Bekius, MSN '01. This award recognizes a nursing alum whose dedicated work and exemplary service have benefited society and the profession of nursing. Recipients have demonstrated community service on a local, state, national or international level.

Julie knew she wanted to be a nurse from a young age. A native of West Michigan, Julie started her nursing journey at Grand Valley State University (GVSU), earning her BSN in 1997. After three years working as an RN, she decided to pursue her dream of becoming a Nurse Practitioner. Julie discovered an MSU program that allowed her to attend classes in Muskegon, Michigan where a MSU professor in East Lansing taught over satellite video. She earned her MSN from the MSU College of Nursing in 2001. Before virtual learning was commonplace, this innovative program allowed Julie to engage in the Spartan experience while working full-time in the Grand Rapids area.

Julie worked for 10 years in several areas of practice including family practice, allergy and asthma, retail medicine, and physical rehabilitation, before finding her passion in palliative care. Though challenging, she considers it an honor and privilege to be with patients through serious illness, often lending emotional support in addition to medical care. When Julie started a dozen years ago, she worked primarily in the inpatient setting for palliative care. At the time, Corewell Health (formerly Spectrum Health) offered only two half-day palliative care clinics per month. Now, the program offers clinics both in person in Grand Rapids, and virtually at five regional cancer centers across Michigan. Julie's advocacy was integral to expanding access to palliative care at Corewell Health.

Julie still works one day a week in the palliative care clinic, but recently, she has shifted her focus toward empowering the next generation of nurses. After receiving her DNP from Missouri-based Maryville University in 2023, Julie earned a tenure-track position at GVSU, where she teaches in the undergraduate and graduate programs through didactic, clinical and simulation courses. She also serves as project advisor to DNP students and faculty advisor for the GVSU student Chapter of Michigan Council of Nurse Practitioners (MiCNP).

In 2024, Julie co-led a study abroad program to Cape Coast, Ghana, where BSN students provided care in community clinics while being immersed in the culture. She also participated in a medical mission trip through her church to Tima, Egypt, where they held six free medical clinics in the surrounding communities. In 2025, Julie became the chair of the Study Abroad Task Force at the GVSU Kirkhof College of Nursing.

Julie is also engaged in Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing, Hospice and Palliative Nursing Association and the MiCNP.

Overall, Julie believes that service is at the heart of nursing. She is grateful for the support she has received from her family and mentors throughout her career and education journey, which has allowed her to follow her passion for helping others, whether it be on a local or global level.



Alexis Skuras, BSN '18, DNP '23, is the Spring 2025 Michigan State University College of Nursing Recent Graduate Achievement awardee. This award recognizes an alum who graduated within the past 10 years and has obtained a high level of professional accomplishments including but not limited to: contributions to their employer, history of promotion, military accomplishments, continued education, or published work.

Alexis is an educator, student and doer. From a young age, Alexis had always thought she would become a teacher. Upon arriving at Michigan State University, she found that nursing would be the perfect field to do just that — to serve as a teacher to her patients. Alexis received her BSN from the MSU College of Nursing in 2018 and then worked as an RN at Harper Hospital in Detroit.

Following her passion for education, Alexis returned to MSU to earn her Adult-Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist DNP in 2023, finding it to be the perfect combination of patient care, evidence-based practice and nursing education. As someone who loves to learn and is the first college graduate of her family, Alexis considers earning her doctorate her biggest achievement.

This accomplishment has launched her into the next phase of her career. Alexis is currently a clinical nurse specialist at the 501c3 non-profit organization, Recovery Mobile Clinic (RMC) and is the first to join their team since it was founded in 2020. The clinic specializes in the care of patients with substance use disorders. The RMC takes an integrated care approach to address basic primary care needs and mental health to set up patients for success in their recovery, such as by administrating 1,159 of the revolutionary Vivitrol shots in 2024, which manage cravings and prevent relapse.

Alexis also teaches undergraduate students part-time as an assistant professor at MSU's Detroit Campus during the summers. Additionally, she mentors DNP students from MSU and Saginaw Valley State University (SVSU), often taking them on the road with the RMC to gain hands-on experience.

Earning her doctorate was not where Alexis ended her education. She is currently enrolled at SVSU to earn her psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner certification. Her favorite way to spend her spare time is having fun with her one-eyed Pitbull, Fetty.

Upon reflection, Alexis called her years as an MSU student the best time of her life, attributing the friends she made and the mentorship she received from faculty, such as Jackeline Iseler and Emily McIntire. Alexis lives out the Spartan will by working toward a future with less stigma and barriers to care for people with substance use disorders.



Margaret Muir, BSN '83, is the recipient of the Spring 2025 Michigan State University College of Nursing Distinguished Alumni Award. This award recognizes an alum who has advanced the nursing profession through professional accomplishments and commitment to nursing education, practice and research.

When Margaret embarked on a trip to North Carolina with two fellow MSU nursing students shortly before graduation, she never could have predicted how a stop at Duke University would change the trajectory of her life. After earning her BSN from the MSU College of Nursing in 1983, she moved to North Carolina and has been employed with the Duke University Health System for the last 41 years.

After serving as a staff nurse and an educator at the university hospital, Margaret was encouraged to transition into a role at Duke Regional Hospital, tasked with building trust between the hospital and community. Unsure, yet determined, Margaret took the leap into community care. Twenty-five years later, she continuously goes above and beyond as their patient experience officer to ensure patients receive the best care possible.

Margaret believes that the key to exceptional patient care is to first provide staff with proper resources and support — from trainings on how to yield the best patient experience survey results to "just because" coffee for hospital staff on their way into work. After realizing that there was a gap in resources for providing culturally competent care to transgender patients, Margaret made it the focus of her DNP thesis, which she earned from the University of North Carolina Greensboro in 2018. Now, she regularly teaches classes on transgender care to healthcare workers, nursing students and other community leaders.

Margaret is consistently seeking opportunities to serve the community. She has organized 33 American Red Cross blood drives and given 13 gallons of blood herself. After noticing that nurses were purchasing clothes for patients with their own money, she applied for a grant to open a Community Caring Closet at Duke Regional Hospital, where staff could pick up clothes for patients who needed them. She receives \$10,000 annually in grant funding to keep the closet stocked with items for patients in need.

Margaret may have built a successful career in North Carolina, but she remains close to her Michigan roots, crediting her mother for encouraging her to pursue nursing at MSU. Furthermore, Margaret credits her MSU CON education for laying the foundation of the innovative mindset that drives her to always go one step further in caring for her patients and community. Margaret exemplifies the Spartan spirit in all she does.



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
